




Graduation 2021 Updates

Creativity in the Science Laboratories using "Smart Carts"

The Science laboratories were abuzz with excitement as the students of F4 and F5 used the newly acquired sophisticated "smart carts" to investigate concepts of Mechanics. The students were introduced to the functioning of different electronic sensors available in the laboratory, after which they designed and conducted their own experiments.





F.2 Interdisciplinary Unit

Individuals & Societies and Science have started an IDU on Water and Rivers in March. Students have started a study on the impact of human activities on the Lam Tsuen River in Tai Po. Water samples were provided to students to conduct laboratory tests on the quality of water in Science lessons. Satellite maps were also provided to students to investigate the biodiversity and human activities in the Lam Tsuen River drainage basin. The final task is to write a letter to a local district councillor, identifying and explaining the problems that local residents are experiencing with the water quality of the river, then suggest a solution that would mitigate or solve the problem.

Establishing Networks with Primary Schools in Hong Kong

Besides promoting CSS via different social media channels, the Admissions & Marketing Team also establishes connections with primary schools in Hong Kong so as to introduce our MY1 and Secondary 1 entries. In the last few months, we have invited several DSS and private primary schools, and international schools to visit CSS. We have introduced our facilities and discussed the arrangement of MY1 and S.1 admissions.





Online Information Session for New MY1 and Secondary 1 Parents and Students (For the Cohort of 2021 – 2022)




Modelling by Biology Students






Community Project PGP session

Over 150 students participated in the One Person One Flower Scheme which is organised by the Leisure and Cultural Services Department. Students have shown their planting progress by taking pictures and/or completing planting logs. We received positive comments from students and parents.

Recognition will be given for students who manage the planting methods, planting logs and self-reflection well. Awards will be given for each form of student.

Mindfulness Workshops

To help students to understand what resilience means and that it is a natural human ability that we can build up on, rather than something you just have or don't have, a number of sessions have been arranged. These are for Form 3 and Form 5 focusing on "Building Resilience & Using Mindfulness for Stress Reduction".

Mindshift

We are currently running a programme called <CSS x HKU Mindshift> for Form 3 and Form 4 students. Students have an opportunity to equip themselves with skills and knowledge to deal with mental health concerns, as well as enhancing students' empathy towards people with mental illnesses throughout the programme led by a group of professionals. Students will be encouraged to handle stress and adversity, as well as promoting a positive outlook on life.

In order to enhance the awareness of the school community about mental well-being, our group of students is currently composing a song about mental health and is planning some whole school events for all forms of students. The first whole school event - <Mental health Q&A> will be on 26 March 2021 during tutor time. This is an interhouse competition and students can earn house points for their house through their participation.







Positive Education

Positive Education brings together the science of Positive Psychology with best practice teaching, to encourage and support individuals, schools and communities to flourish. In working with the Institute of Positive Education (IPE), CSS is going to build into the Personal Growth Programme starting in 2021-22 with IPE's Positive Education Enhanced Curriculum (PEEC).

HKFYG Activities

Even under the Pandemic, CSS x HKFYG volunteers still take care of people in need in the Tseung Kwan O district. With regular meetings and training sessions, students do not just help with large-scale volunteer services organized by the HKFYG, but also initiate, organize and execute their own ideas & need assessments as student-led volunteer services. Services include Digital Ambassador, Cooking for the Elderly to spread love, Chinese New Year Ambassador, Neighbour First Scheme (鄭舍第一計劃) for the community and more.




Chinese Costumes Study



Chinese Costumes Study is one of the CLACH programs this year. The program runs as a CCA which is led by Chinese teachers and open to all CSS students. It aims to broaden students' knowledge in Chinese culture by raising their interest in Chinese costumes. Through this programme, students will know more about traditional Chinese costumes through different Imperial's costume, gender, and national minority. The programme will share the collection of photos and videos to students. They can mention the characteristics of the Chinese costumes after watching the related shows. They can create a paperboard model of Chinese costumes by themselves and wear the costumes we prepared for them and take photos.


Chinese Mentoring Programme
