Creative Week Updates

Due to the uncertainties brought on by COVID-19, local full-day programmes have been planned to offer to students for Creative Week. We are exploring various options including day camps, service learning opportunities, and sporting activities such as mountaineering, yoga and creative arts workshops. We acknowledge that the current COVID-19 restrictions and possibly prolonged class suspension may lead to the postponement of Creative Week. We will follow the guidelines from the Education Bureau when arranging various programmes. Students' and teachers' safety and well-being are always our top priorities.

Updates from our Social Workers

This year, despite the pandemic, we have taken the opportunity to start a **HKFYG x CSS Volunteer Group** as a CCA, to connect students who would love to serve. We have continually organised a wide range of activities and volunteer opportunities for our students. First, the **Beach Cleansing Day** - students collected 450kg of trash (which was startling!) from Tap Mun Island in a day. Also, students learned to make

cookies for children in the Halloween Party, and designed fun games for them. Besides, a group of senior students initiated a tutoring programme for the junior form students (S.T.A.G. -Student Taught Academic Group), to provide 1 to 1 tutoring sessions for new students with the subjects they are strong at. Furthermore, We launched the U-Kitchen Project, several Form 4 to 5 students organised events and cooked food for the elderly and low income families in the TKO community. It was a blessing to have numerous parents and students supporting and donating food to make the programme a success. Lastly, CCA volunteers and the HKFYG LOHAS Youth S.P.O.T. are organising various online events and activities for kids and teens to enjoy a special Christmas - Online Christmas x Wellness Events on 19 Dec, e.g. Human Library, Zentangle & Calligraphy workshops and Music Concert, in order to show their caring and raise the awareness of mental wellness for youths in Hong Kong.



Updates from the Counseling Team

Our counselling team offers a range of programmes, activities and counselling services to build up a caring and supportive atmosphere in school and to encourage students to enhance their social and psychological well-being. We also value our partner and provide support to our parents and staff. On 30 September 2020, we ran counselling training for the staff team in order to promote the importance of one's well-being and to share strategies on handling students with emotional needs.

On 12 and 19 November 2020, we conducted a seminar -<lt is okay to be not okay!> for F6 and F5 students respectively. The seminar's objective was to increase students' awareness to their mental well-being and explore strategic ways to cope with challenges in their daily lives. Moreover, we are currently running a programme called <CSS x HKU Mind-shift> for F3 and F4 students this year. Students have the opportunity to equip themselves with skills and knowledge to deal with mental health concerns, as well as to enhance students' empathy towards people with mental illnesses throughout the programme led by a group of professionals. On 3 December 2020, it was a great honor and pleasure to invite the psychiatrist, Dr Jessie Lin, as our guest speaker to share some stress management skills and mindfulness skills with our F2 and F3 students in our PGP. It is hoped that our

students can get as much support as we can offer during the pandemic.

We are always here to support students and to address students' concerns when they need help.

Higher Education Updates

The Careers Team are excited to share with you our Higher Education progress this term. Despite school closures, many F6 online careers seminars have taken place including information sharing on Hong Kong, UK, US, Canada, Australian university applications and our successful art portfolio workshop. Our annual University Fair went virtual, with forty-five local and overseas universities providing videos to introduce their campuses, admission requirements and course content. A big thank you goes to HKUST for their live event designed especially for our Form 5/6 CSS students. Alumni joined in the event to share university experiences and it was exciting to see familiar faces and hear their stories.

Hong Kong and the UK remain our two most popular university destinations and we are now in the position where students are receiving conditional offers from the UK, in particular from Bristol, Durham and Manchester Universities. We have seven F6 students who are preparing enthusiastically for their HKU, HKUST and City U interviews this week. Applicants to the US, Canada and Australia also have ongoing online applications and we eagerly await the results. We are proud of students' adaptability in these times of uncertainty and we feel optimistic about future undergraduate offers.

Careers Education is an important part of our preparation for future careers pathways at CSS and we are excited that even Form 1 are involved this year. In the PGP programme, they are identifying their personal achievements and qualities, interviewing adults about their job roles and creating a simple career plan. It's never too young to start! Both F4 and F5 complete careers activities in our PGP sessions to assist their decision making and are looking ahead for 2021 summer internships.

F6 HKDSE Pre-mock Exams

Despite challenging times, F6 HKDSE students showed their commitment to the public exam by undertaking externally arranged and marked exams in the DSE core subjects of English, Chinese, Maths and Liberal Studies in November and December 2020. Students balanced an already heavy workload with the need to gain meaningful exam practice, before they head into the crucial next few months.

International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP) -Extended Essay (EE)



Form 5 - The EE is one of the three compulsory components of the IBDP core. Our Form 5 IBDP students have now firmly begun their EE journey, having attended the online launch of their EE process at the end of November where Ms Guevara and Mr O'Leary briefed the students about the exciting work ahead. This is a great opportunity for IBDP students to work independently on a research topic chosen by themselves and all students this week submitted their top three preferred topics linked to a subject studied at IBDP. We are pleased to confirm that nearly all students were allocated their first choice and have had a specialist supervisor allocated to them for guidance in the year to come.

Form 6 - Our Form 6 IBDP students should feel not only proud, but also relieved, that they have now reached the end of their EE journey. This has culminated with the submission of their final essay, a viva voce (interview) with their subject supervisor and the completion of three mandatory reflection sessions on their progress throughout the last year. A wide range of topics and foci were covered by students researching into their own areas of interest and passion. Well done everyone.

F3 & F4 Reports, Options and Parent Conference Updates

As part of the ongoing process of supporting parents and students in making the right subject choices for

next year, we are delighted to confirm that we are very much moving forwards with a range of events and mechanisms that offer efficient information sharing and resources.

This week saw the successful launch of a new platform within our CSS school system that allows F4 and F3 parents to access, read and download pdf copies of their child's Semester 1 report. The F4 parent conference this week also offered the opportunity to discuss student subject strengths and interests online with teachers and hopefully helped to inform the important option decisions being made. We look forward to engaging with F3 parents and students alike at their F3 parent conference in January. We are inviting F3 and F4 students to submit their options from 17th December but would remind everyone that it is not first come first serve so please reflect carefully before confirming choices ahead of the deadlines.

Life in the Laboratory during restrictions

The Physics Laboratory became alive again, once the students returned to school

in September. Within the boundaries of social distancing and other safety precautions, we were able to provide opportunities to the students to explore the wonders of science. While the curious F5 students investigated projectile motion, F4 students demonstrated collaborative skills through group presentations. The F3 students showed excellent research skills through their investigation on effect of catalase on rate of reaction, while the ever - enthusiastic F1s had a fantastic time sliding cars down ramps and creating foam with detergents.



In other parts of the school laboratories, F4 Biology students completed the unit of reproduction in flowering plants by dissecting Stargazer lilies (*Lilium orientalis*) while identifying and annotating the parts of the reproductive system.

Meanwhile F5 Biology students counted oxygen bubbles when investigating factors that affect photosynthesis. They completed an SBA on the effects of light intensity and carbon dioxide concentration on the rate of photosynthesis.





In F6, Biology students successfully extracted DNA from bananas and ran a gel to determine the most likely off-spring in a parentage case.



For the first year, Creative Secondary School will participate in the HKUST underwater robotics competition. The team made up of Kaushiki Chaturvedi (F2De), Shreyaan Vashishtha (F2Ja), Nikolas Fung (F1Ca), Stanson Chan (F1Ju) and Sharlene Hui (F1Ba) were selected from a field of application where the students needed to write why robotics will be important in the future. The team will be set a challenge in the qualifying round in January 2021 to see if they can make it into the main competition.

Physical Education during online learning and teaching

Despite going back to working online, students have been making sure that they are staying active by exercising. Some class activities have included home workouts with students designing their own fitness challenges and sharing some of their creative ideas with their friends.


Chinese History

Teaching materials: A painting of "Along the River During the Qingming Festival" and a model of "Ancient Earthquake Detector"





Community Project for Form 3 students has started at CSS: Supporting the community during the COVID-19 pandemic




The MYP team is happy to announce that the Community Project has started for Form 3 students and will last until June 2021. As the culminating experience in the IB Middle Years Programme (MYP), Form 3 students will identify a need in a community, perform research, develop a plan to meet the need, and carry it out by providing the service.

During these challenging times, we have all come to understand and appreciate the role that community service plays within our society. Students have already decided on their groups and future service ideas considering the current situation with COVID19. Here are some good examples shared with us by students: raising awareness about mental health issues of secondary school students and methods to cope with such issues; making an animated film short to spread awareness about certain issues in the community such as the dangers of drugs, or how to protect the environment; making online lessons for little children to advocate a healthy lifestyle and doing sport in the era of COVID19. Now it is the supervisors` turn to choose a CP to supervise.

After the action has taken place, students will then present their experiences and outcomes and reflect on what impact their service made on the community as well as on themselves. Research and planning experiences that took place during the project will also be shared, as well as reflections upon their own personal growth in collaboration, communication, critical and creative thinking skills.

Bouldering Wall





Bouldering is a branch of sports climbing in which climbers would climb on a wall no taller than 5 metres without ropes or harnesses. We have successfully applied for QEF funding to build a bouldering wall near Court C. If everything goes well, the wall will start to be built in the summer of 2021. By the beginning of the school year 2021-2022. Students should be able to make use of the wall, through which students can develop problem solving, planning and decision making abilities. In addition, they can build confidence and self-esteem.

Solar Harvest

Solar Harvest is a Government programme to promote the development of local renewable energy. It provides subsidy and one-stop service to help eligible schools to install smallscale solar PV systems at their premises. We have joined the project and the Solar PV Systems is expected to be installed in the coming month. After the completion of the project, we will give students a better understanding of renewable energy and we will make use of the system to enrich the teaching of STEM and environmental education.



Student Portal

During the age of pandemics, we need to have a new way to distribute information to our students and parents. We have made a head start already to develop our student Portal to distribute timetables and report cards. As the year progresses, we will continue to update our portal to provide more information to the students and parents - including a central store for school notices and useful learning resources for students.



Canteen

To protect our students while they are eating in the canteen, we have installed transparent acrylic sheets in the canteen and we have regular disinfection to make the canteen safe.
